What is 'Sports Grant'? 2015 / 2016

The Government is providing sports funding for primary schools of £450 million over the three academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

How will we be spending the Sports Funding?

DEVELOPING SPORT AT NORTH WALKDEN

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. At North Walkden CP School, the funding we received for 2015/16 was £8715. We are given the freedom to spend it in ways that develop and improve the delivery of Physical Education and activity for our children.
