


Brazil

<u>Key Facts</u>

- Brazil is a huge and diverse country located on the continent of South America.
- There are around 212 million people living in Brazil.
- The Amazon rainforest is the largest tropical rainforest in the world.
- Urbanisation occurs when more a population move to live in urban areas rather than rural areas.
- The geography of Brazil is so diverse as it has mountain ranges, the Amazon rainforest, rivers and waterfalls, desert and coastline.

- There are approximately 400 different tribes living in the Amazon rainforest
- Many of these tribes have little contact with others outside their own community

Glossary of Vocabulary

Who lives in the Amazon rainforest?

Urbanisation—is when more of a population move to living in urban areas rather than rural areas.

Diverse—different

Favela—is a very poor and crowded area of a city in Brazil.

Population—Number of people living in an area.

Rainforest—is a forest, generally composed of tall, broadleaved trees and usually found in wet tropical uplands

Migration—is the movement of people from one place to another with intentions of settling, permanently or temporarily, at a new location.
