

## Report to Parents: 2013/14

### **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

In June 2014, 50% were eligible for PPG. KS2 results were;

- 93% L4+ in Maths, 32% L5. 4% children gained a Level 6 in maths and writing.
- 93% L4 + in Reading and 25% L5.
- 88% achieved L4 in both Maths and English
- 79% achieved L4 in Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, with 50% achieving Level 5.
- 100% made 2 levels or more progress in Maths and 96% made 2 levels progress in English
- 27% made 3 levels progress in English and 27% in Maths
- 100% children eligible for PPG, made 2 levels or more progress in Maths. 8% made 3 levels progress.
- 100% children eligible for PPG made 2 levels or more progress in Reading. 15% made 3 levels progress.

These levels of attainment compare very favourably with the national median, being above the national median in all subjects for Level 4+, and close to or above in other areas.

We will continue to use this grant to accelerate pupil progress and enrich children's experiences to help them become increasingly confident in all aspects of learning.
