



## Year 3 Online Safety



### What do I already know?

- I know how technology is used in school and outside of school.
- I know what to do if I find something inappropriate online or something I am unsure of (including identifying people who can help; minimising screen; online reporting using school system etc).
- I can use the internet for learning and communicating with others, making choices when navigating through sites.
- I can consider other people's feelings on the internet
- I can explain why some information I find online may not be true
- I can demonstrate how to navigate a simple webpage to get to information I need
- I can explain how other people's identity online can be different to their identity in real life.



### Vocabulary

**Digital content**— Any content or information in digital form.

**Cyberbully/cyberbullying**— The use of electronic communication to bully a person

**Reliable**— Check information is true

**Sceptical**— not easily convinced

**Verify**— Make sure something is true and accurate

**Fake news**— information that is not true

### What will I learn?

- I use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly.
- I can explain ways in which and why I might change my identity depending on what I am doing online (e.g. gaming, using an avatar and social media).
- I can explain some risks of communicating online with others I don't know well
- I can recognise I need to be careful before I share anything about myself or others online.
- I can explain what bullying is and can describe how people may bully others.
- I can explain why spending too much time using technology can sometimes have a negative impact on me;
- I recognise the difference between the work of others which has been copied (plagiarism) and re-structuring and re-presenting materials in ways which are unique and new.
- I can explain and demonstrate how to use email safely.
