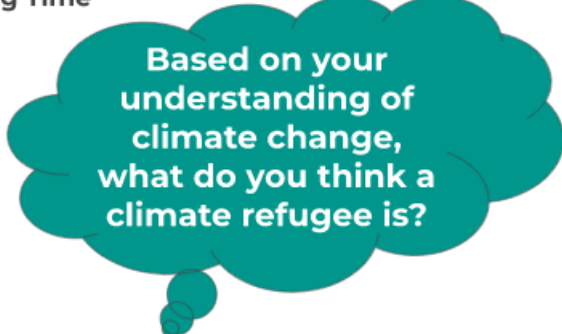

National migration

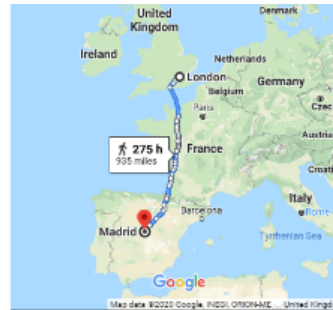
Movement from one region to another, within the SAME country.

Glossary of Vocabulary.

- **Migration**—the movement of people from one place to another place.
- **Emigrant**—is a migrant who is leaving their source country.

- **Economic migrant**—is a person who moves from one place to another place for economic reasons, e.g. employment.
- **Refugee**—is a person who has been forced to leave their home, e.g. due to war or a natural disaster.
